

\$600 minimum for delivery by our truck; no minimum for UPS delivery or for pick up at the Nursery. Please call in advance to allow us time to pull your order.

Flats are sold in whole tray units only; 3 & 4 Qt pots are sold individually. All are tagged with plant names and cultivars.

## **HANOVER FARMS DELIVERY**

All orders are required to meet a \$600 minimum. Our delivery fee is 10% of the order total for local deliveries (within 50 miles), with a minimum delivery charge of \$75.00, and 19% for deliveries over 50 miles, with a minimum of \$100.00.

We ship on rolling carts. Help is appreciated in unloading your order.

## SHIPPING METHODS

**Boxed Shipments** - Shipment by UPS is available for groundcovers sold in flats for orders that do not meet our delivery minimum. We do not ship 3 & 4 Qt material by UPS. UPS freight cost is based on product weight. The boxing and handling charge is \$4.00 per box. We suggest shipping Monday through Wednesday to avoid a weekend delivery.

**Large shipments outside of our delivery area** - Can be shipped palletized by UPS or FedEx. Customers are responsible for scheduling pick-up, delivery, and all shipping costs for these orders. You must have a forklift or a loading dock. Please call for a quote.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**Payment** - Our terms are cash, check, or major credit card at the time of sale. All accounts are COD until a credit application has been received and approved. For those who have established credit and maintained a record of prompt payment, our terms are due 30 days from the invoice date.

**Past-due accounts** (over 30 days) - Will be charged a service charge of 1.5% per month plus collection costs. Accounts past 60 days are cash only. If a credit card is used to pay a Net 30 account after the date of the sale, a fee of 5% will be charged. There will be a \$35.00 added charge for returned checks.

Clump-forming for mass planting or borders with long-blooming daisy-like flowers in late summer into fall. Adaptable to poor soils, heat, and sun, to some shade.

## **ECHINACEA**

### *Coneflower*

Clump forming for mass planting or borders. Long-blooming, daisy-like flowers in late summer - fall. Adaptable to poor soils, heat, sun to some shade, deer resistant.

Bright orange petals with matching orange cone, 18-20"

Bright golden-yellow blooms with a cooper cone, compact, early bloomer, 18-24"

Blooms emerge orange and transition to soft red with dark cone, 18-24"

## FERNS

**3 QT/ EACH - \$5.50**

Shade and moisture are required for this perennial group. Generally reproduce by producing spores. Similar to flowering plants, ferns have roots, stems, and leaves.



**Adiantum pedatum - 'Five-Finger Northern Maidenhair'**

**Native**, spreading to a tabletop of light green fronds, 15-24", damp but not wet shade, deciduous

**Athyrium niponicum - 'Pictum' - 'Japanese Painted'**  
Lacy, variegated foliage, spreading to 12" high, moist to semi-moist shade, deciduous



**Athyrium filix-femina - 'Lady'**  
**Native**, light green, medium size, slowly spreading, erect fronds, 24-36", damp shade to damp sun, deciduous



**Cyrtomium fortunei - 'Fortune's Holly'**  
Prefers moist shade, 18-30"



**Dryopteris erythrosora - 'Autumn Brilliance'**  
Medium rosettes, new foliage has orange-bronze cast, damp to dry shade, evergreen, 24-30"



**Matteuccia struthiopteris - 'Ostrich'**  
**Native**, Large rosettes 24-36" large erect fronds, damp shade to damp sun, deciduous



**Osmunda cinnamomea - 'Cinnamon'**  
**Native**, medium green, large 36-48" rosette, cinnamon-colored fertile fronds form in spring, deciduous



**Polystichum polyblepharum - 'Tassel'**  
Dark green, glossy fronds, 12-18" rosette, damp to dry shade, evergreen



## HELLEBORUS

### *Lenten Rose*

Blooms late winter into spring, long-lasting, striking rose-like flowers, best in some shade protection, slow to grow but becomes nicer every year.



#### **orientalis**

Clump-forming, white, pink, green, or smoky purple flowers, growing up to 2'



#### **x nigersmithii - 'Ivory Prince' (pp)**

Bushy, clump-forming, ivory flowers, burgundy-pink buds, 12"-18"

## HEMEROCALLIS

### *Daylily*

Produces masses of flowers in full sun, hot and dry conditions. While the individual flowers live only one day, many are classified as rebloomers with some flowering activity throughout the growing season.



#### **'Happy Returns'**

Light yellow repeat bloomer with 3" flowers, excellent dwarf variety growing to 18" tall, adapts to dry conditions



#### **'Stella d'Oro'**

Fragrant golden-yellow repeat bloomer, very prolific dwarf selection only growing to 15"

## HEUCHERA

### *Coral Bells*

Dense, mounded plants with lobed foliage. Succeeds best in the morning sun with midday and afternoon shade, long-blooming flowers on wiry stems above the plant. Evergreen foliage, plant in well-drained soil.

#### **'Caramel' (pp)**

Butterscotch leaves with purple-toned underside, exhibits good tolerance of hot & humid summer weather. Pink to white blooms appear in July, 12"



#### **'Citronelle' (pp)**

Light yellow-green leaves with silver underside, creamy white flowers, 12"



#### **'Frosted Violet' (pp)**

Pink-purple leaves mature to a silvery-purple shade. Fine hairs on the leaves give a frosted appearance



#### **'Green Spice' (pp)**

Silver leaves with burgundy veins and creamy white flowers. Drought, heat, and humidity-tolerant, 2'x2'



#### **'Guacamole' (pp)**

Lime green wavy leaves, creamy white flowers in spring - summer. A bright selection for the full-shade garden



#### **'Magma' (pp)**

Bright pink foliage turns to vibrant red. Pink blooms spring - summer, 24"





**'Midnight Rose' (pp)**

Dark purple to nearly black foliage with bright pink streaks and spots, 10"



**'Obsidian' (pp)**

Clump-forming, dark, deep purple, almost black leaves remain dark throughout the growing season. Rounded, lobed, long-petiole leaves form a compact basal mound to 8-10"



**'Palace Purple'**

Deep purple leaves fading to bronze in Summer heat, thrives in partial shade, clumping



**'Plum Pudding' (pp)**

Shimmering plum-purple foliage with silver veining, Greenish-white blooms spring through summer, 8-24"



**'Silver Scrolls' (pp)**

Dark purple leaves with silver overlay and dark veining, 12-18"



**'Watermelon' (pp)**

Peachy-pink leaves with silver markings, white flowers, 10-14"

## HEUCHERELLA

*Foamy Bells*

*Cross between Heuchera and Tiarella. Long blooming, deer resistant.*

**'Solar Eclipse' (pp)**

Brownish-red leaves with chartreuse edges, white flowers, 10-16"



**'Pink Revolution' (pp)**

Bright pink flowers sit high above green foliage, profuse bloomer, 15"

## HOSTA

*Plantain Lily*

Well suited for our Zone 5-7 climates and thrive in light-shaded locations. Prefers moisture but can survive dry periods.

**'Abiqua Drinking Gourd'**

Blue-green leaves, white flowers, 18"



**'Albo Marginata'**

Medium green leaves with white edges, 18", pale lavender flower, may lose variegation in summer



**'Blue Angel'**

Biggest of the blue varieties, heart-shaped blue-gray leaves, white flowers, 36", spreads almost 4'





**'Bulletproof'**

Thick, blue, heart-shaped leaves, lavender flowers, grows up to 2'



**'Elegans'**

Large corrugated blue-gray leaves, white flowers, 30, needs good shade



**'Francee'**

Dark green leaves with narrow white margins, 24", pale lavender flowers, good sun tolerance



**'Frances Williams'**

Blue-green, wide heart-shaped leaves with yellow margins, growing to 24", white flowers



**'Gold Standard'**

Gold, heart-shaped leaves bordered with a dark green margin, violet flowers, 24-30"



**'Guacamole'**

Chartreuse-green leaves, fragrant white flowers, 22"



**'Halycon'**

A great choice for a compact blue variety. Heavily textured leaves, pale-blue late summer spikes, medium height, 18"

**'June'**

Gold leaves bordered by a blue-green shade margin. Slug-resistant, pale lavender flowers in August, 16"



**'Ki Ren Jyaku'**

Soft chartreuse-yellow foliage, double purple flowers, 24"



**'Krossa Regal'**

Silver-blue pointed leaves, pale lilac flowers, 18", holds blue color well



**'Liberty' (pp)**

Thick leaves with blue-green centers and neon-yellow margins, slug resistant, purple blooms in July 24"



**'Minuteman'**

White margins surround dark green leaves. Grows to 20" tall, lavender spikes in late summer



**'Night Before Christmas'**

Huge dark green leaves with creamy white centers that change to pure white by mid-summer. Pale lavender flowers



**'Patriot'**

Green leaves with white margins, lavender blooms, 22", excellent sun tolerance





**'Paul's Glory'**

Chartreuse heart-shaped leaves bordered by blue-green margins. Lavender flowers in July, 24"



**'Stained Glass'**

Bright golden green leaves with dark green margins, 24"



**'Sum & Substance'**

Large yellow-green leaves, 30", lavender flowers

**HYPERICUM  
CALYCINUM**

Green leaves with 3" bright yellow flowers, sun to partial shade, grows 15-18" high. Spreading by rhizomes, it will form a dense colony over time, attracting butterflies, and has little interest to deer.

**LAVANDULA**

*Lavender*

Best in full sun and well-drained soil. Grey-green to silver foliage, lavender to purple fragrant flowers. Tolerates heat and humidity well. Zones 5-9.



**angustifolia 'Hidcote'**

Deep violet-blue flowers, compact silver-grey foliage

**intermedia 'Grosso' (pp)**

French hybrid, highly fragrant, deep violet spikes, grows to 36" tall



**intermedia 'Phenomenal' (pp)**

Compact, silvery foliage, purple flowers



**intermedia 'Sensational' (pp)**

Broad, thick, bright silver leaves, intense purple, strong stems, good for cut flowers

***Creeping Jenny, Golden Moneywort, Loosestrife***

**'Goldilocks'**

Fast-growing, bright yellow groundcover for full sun or some shade. Will invade if allowed. Good for edges in container gardens. Happiest in a moist location.

Gray-green fragrant foliage with blue-purple flowers, full sun, including hot & dry areas once established. A great choice for mass planting for a wave of blue. Cut back when blooms begin to fade, to extend bloom season.


